Climate change has exposed water security globally as a key issue and it is now a community expectation that we use the right water for the right purpose and increase our water efficiency and recycling at every opportunity. Water stewardship is a more recently termed phrase for managing sustainably our interactions with the natural water cycle – something that First Nations peoples, as the oldest living culture on earth, have been successfully managing as part of the broader environment.

At Yindjibarndi Water we passionately believe that there are better ways to manage our water, as we are decedents from a perfectly created ecosystem and our footprint are our evidence that we have lived and adjusted to the balancing of all political, economic, and social development needs. 



The Yindjibarndi live and maintain social and cultural cohesion under the 5 pillars of Yindjibarndi laws.

- · Nyinyart: laws of reciprocity to care and share.
- Galharra: laws of relationship to connect, unit, preserve and continue.
- Language: laws of truth telling and commitment (binding contract).
- Birdirra: laws of ceremony (traditional lore) community obligation and responsibilities.
- Ngurra: laws of the land (all things are important and treated as equals).





WATER MANAGEMENT

Water Management is a key step in the self determination pathway of building water management and business opportunities within the water industry. Yindjibarndi Water can assist or partner with other Aboriginal owned businesses to build capacity and develop water infrastructure opportunities whether it be in bulk water supply, bespoke water products or function as a water utility.

Yindjibarndi Water, having gained a cultural awareness and understanding of water in an area, or a nation can then assess the quality and significance of water data and information to develop a water balance for a defined catchment. The water balance can then be assessed against cultural, community and commercial demands for water to derive an agreed allocation and water management strategy.

We understand the importance of water monitoring and seek to build capability and capacity into the local First Nations people to proactively manage their water resources.
